Questions to ask candidates

For residents living at height

Joshua Robbins was 23 when a communal safety railing gave way at his home on 29 January 2026. These are a few questions any resident living at height may wish to ask election candidates about No More Falls and the safety of railings, balustrades, balconies and other fall-protection barriers.

A few pointers for residents

- 1 Will you read The Joshua Test Green Paper and tell residents whether you support its proposals?
- 2 Will you support regular, risk-based safety checks of communal railings, balustrades, balconies and other fall-protection barriers?
- 3 Will you support competent inspection and testing when safety records are missing or there are signs of rust, corrosion, cracking, movement, loose fixings or damage?
- 4 Will you press landlords and building owners to tell residents when checks were carried out, what was found and when any repairs will be completed?
- 5 If elected, what practical action will you take to strengthen the rules for inspecting, testing and maintaining residential safety barriers?
- 6 Will you listen to residents living at height, report back on what you have done and give a clear date for your next update?
